Introduction



4Children has always been about children and families. From its origins and response to the changing working patterns of parents and the welfare of so called 'latchkey' children; from when it was established 30 years ago to its pioneering work to deliver joined up local services and support today, children and families, including those with some of the most complex problems, are at the heart of all that we do.

The last 30 years have witnessed some of the most profound economic and social changes for families in the UK: changes to the way we work, care, learn and play that have been set against a backdrop of equally profound changes to family structures and dynamics. As generations live longer, marry, divorce, remarry and live alone, the diversity of the family unit has changed beyond recognition. 4Children understands these changes and works closely with families to provide the support they need in response. Yet despite enormous gains in opportunity over the last 30 years, we enter 2014 as members of a society that is still deeply unequal for children and young people: one in four children are living in poverty; over one million young people aged 16 – 24 are not in employment, education or training; and many children and young people have low aspirations and low self-esteem. A staggering 500,000 families in this country are 'just coping', dropping in and out of crisis with little hope of escape from the vicious circle they are caught up in.

4Children believes a different approach is needed. An approach that listens and responds to what families really want. One that gives children the aspiration and ability to flourish as individuals. An approach that radically changes the country's system of support for those most in need and redesigns our communities for Britain's children and families of the future.

This ambitious goal is at the heart of all that we do, from our powerful campaigns to highlight need and call for change to our informed support and development of services. Over the last ten years our innovative policy into practice programme has demonstrated how the new approach can work: building trusted relationships that offer practical help and challenge; working with families strengths to build resilience for the future and working with the whole family to support both children and parents. We offer help early as problems arise with a relentless focus on turnaround if crisis hits.

Over the next 10 years we will continue to work with our valued partners, with central and local government, schools, health, business, communities and with children and families themselves to reshape this country's public services, spaces and workplaces to help the modern family flourish. 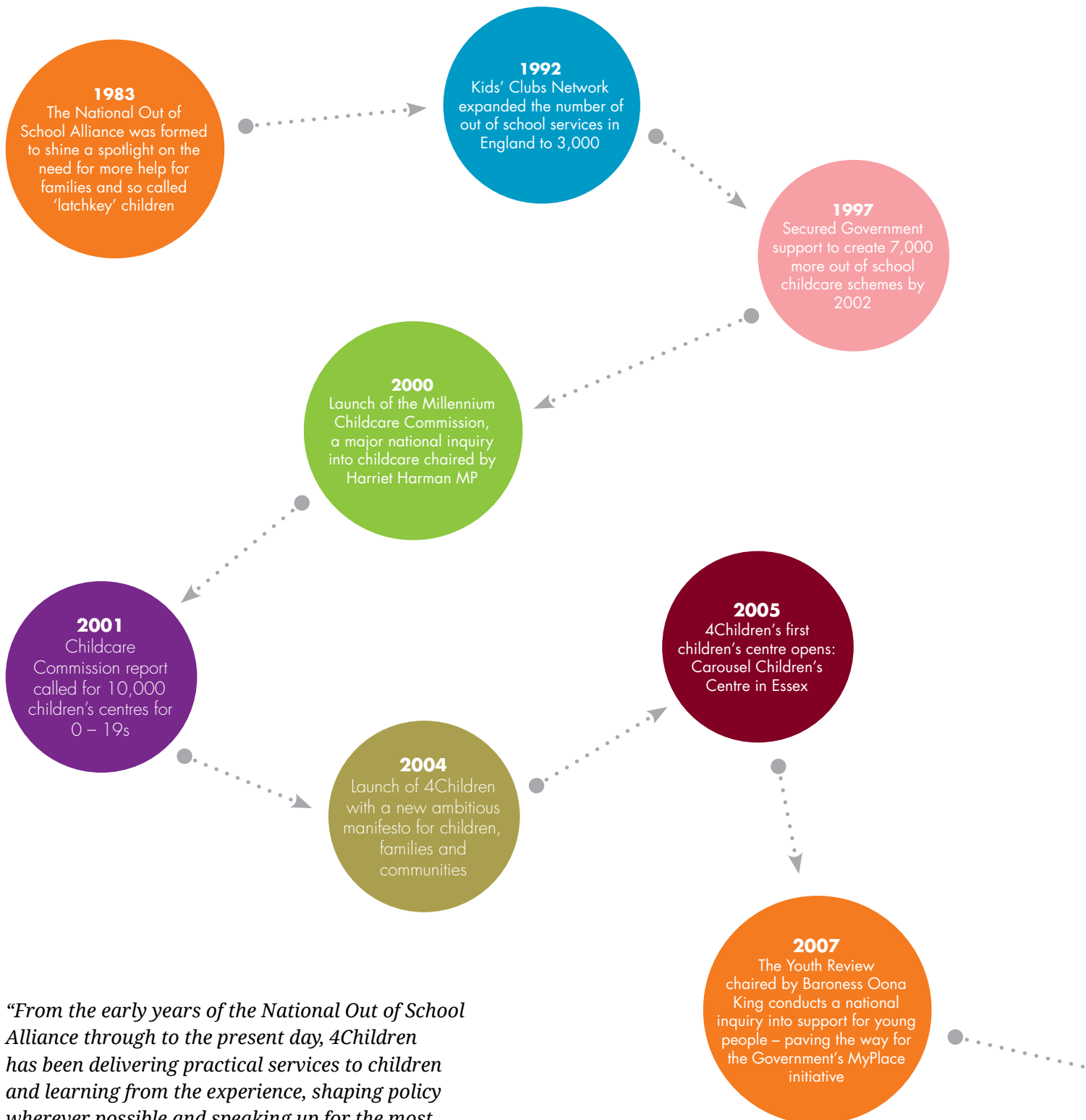

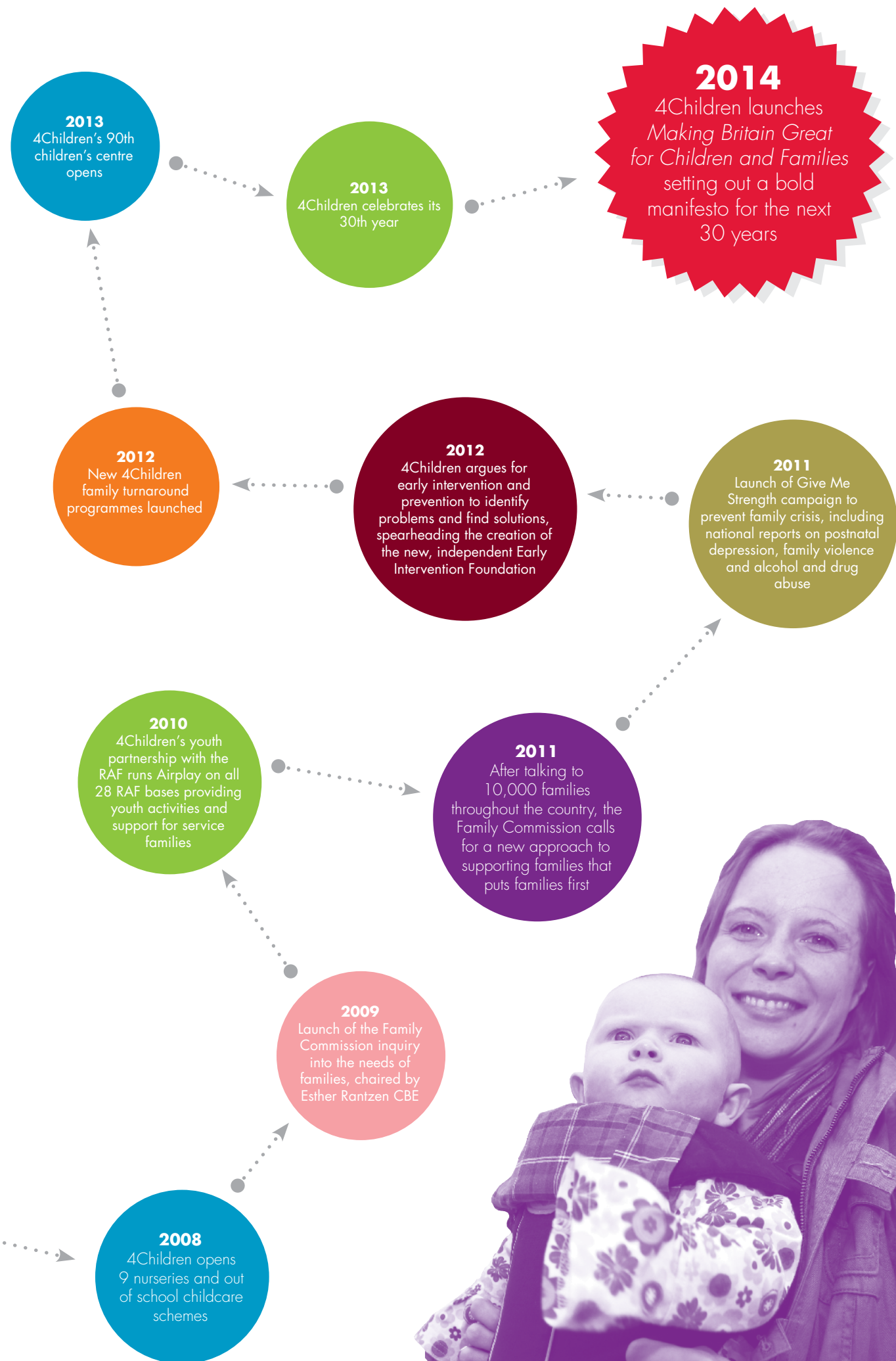
30 Years of 4Children: Delivering for children and families

4Children (or the National Out of School Alliance as it was originally known) was established 30 years ago in response to growing concern about the welfare of so called 'latchkey' children. Since then the charity has gone on to deepen and broaden its work around the needs of all children 0 – 19 and their families. 4Children now delivers services including children's centres, nurseries, out of school clubs and youth and family support for 200,000 children and families in the UK as well as continuing to develop and shape all aspects of policy for children, young people and families.

Shaping the debate for children and families

4Children has been developing, influencing and shaping social policy for 30 years. In that time, we have successfully made the argument for greater access to childcare and out of school activities, Sure Start Children's Centres, youth clubs and better support for families.

4Children is about making a difference – about identifying issues and devising solutions. We are also about change – ensuring policy makers and service providers are focused on the real needs of children and their families and offering practical solutions to meet them.

4Children is a key influencer, ideas shaper and change maker – from Whitehall to the community hall. We know that in order to achieve change for children and families we need to win the argument with those that have the power to make change happen.

We have shown time and time again that we are bringing fresh thinking to old problems and that our ideas continue to shape debates and actions.

- ➔ Our Millennium Childcare Commission called for a children's centre in every community. By March 2010, 3,600 children's centres had been opened across England.
- ➔ Our Make Space Youth Review made the case for a new generation of youth clubs able to meet the needs of young people in the 21st Century.
- ➔ Our Family Commission called for a 'family test' to be applied to all government policy to ensure that it contributes to the goal of strengthening families.

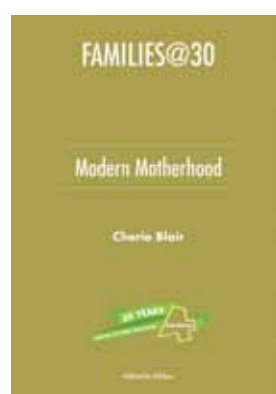
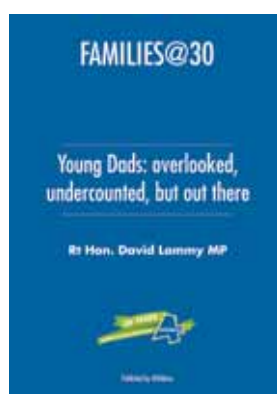
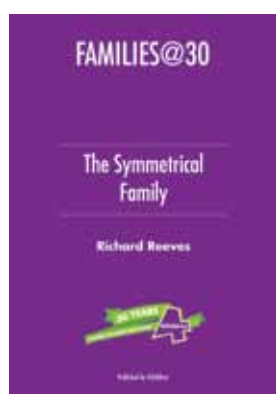

Championing Children's Centres

4Children has long argued the need for children's centres – from our original call for a children's centre in every area in the 2001 Childcare Commission, to our involvement in shaping and supporting their development in every area. The charity now runs almost 100 centres around the country, providing the joined up support that we know children and families need.

- ➔ Our cross party Shout Out for Sure Start campaign highlighted the benefits of children's centres and argued for their development at a key time of budget restrictions.
- ➔ Our annual Children's Centre Census identifies key trends and developments and our work to support the All Parliamentary Group on Sure Start examines good practice and shares learning.

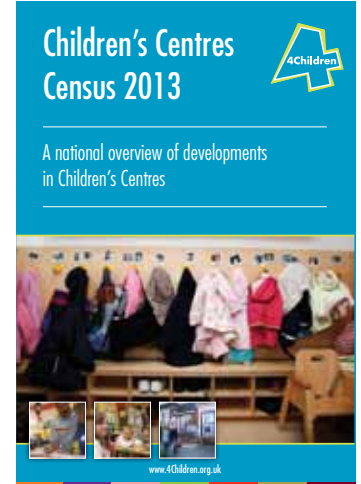

In our manifesto *Making Britain Great for Children and Families*, we argue that children's centres should extend their support to children 0 - 19 and their families and become 'Children and Family Centres'.

The 2013 Census reveals that for the first time over a million families are benefitting from children's centre services and that centres are supporting two-thirds of all disadvantaged families with children under the age of five.



Family Heroes Awards

4Children is proud to have teamed up with Take a Break magazine, Britain's biggest selling magazine to recognise amazing people throughout the country who go above and beyond to make a real difference for children and families.

With hundreds of entries coming in from all areas of the country, our 2013 National Family Hero was Nicola Graham from the North West.

Nicola's world fell apart when her son, Reuben sadly died when he was 23 months old to an undiagnosed and highly aggressive brain tumour. Nicola, and Reuben's dad Mike, didn't want Reuben's death to be in vain and wanted something good to come out of this tragedy. They set themselves a goal of raising £1 million in 23 months to set up a retreat called Reuben's Retreat.

The aim of the retreat is to provide somewhere for families who have children with life threatening or limiting illnesses or who have lost a child to go and just relax, recharge and rebuild their lives.

Leading the strategic partnership

4Children is co-founder of The Children's Partnership, the Government's voluntary sector strategic partner for children and families. The Partnership is leading and supporting the development of high quality sustainable support for children, young people and families through two way communication, policy advice and sector development.

4Children is also working with the Department for Education to pilot integrated childcare through community childcare hubs and support children's centres in extending their reach to disadvantaged families as well as developing an outcomes framework with the early years sector.

4Children has been delighted to work in partnership with Professor Marmott and the Health Equity Institute at the University College London in developing an outcomes framework for children's centres.

Pioneering early intervention

4Children is advocating for a wholesale change to early intervention to prevent problems developing and reduce costs of late intervention. We were proud to become the accountable body for the Early Intervention Foundation in 2013, contracting with the DfE to work with Graham Allen MP and EIF trustees to establish the new organisation.

The Foundation will play a crucial role in shifting the culture and bringing the focus from late to early intervention. We look forward to making early intervention a reality for all children and families. The Foundation was established as an independent charity mid-2013 and 4Children looks forward to a long lasting partnership.

From babies to toddlers and teens to adulthood – we are there to help children develop, learn and flourish.

Daddy cool

4Children centres make sure fathers are included and supported, involving them in all aspects of their child's life.

Positive parenting

There is no definitive 'how to parent' guide but sometimes advice and support can make all the difference. We offer access to a wide range of workshops and courses.

Health Visitors here!

We work with health visitors in all our centres to provide a tailored package of support for local families.

Work club

4Children works with JobCentre Plus, local colleges and other partners to help parents with training and support to find jobs.

Family learning

Our Family Learning courses include ESOL, play and language, school transition, numeracy and literacy.

Horizons – for young parents

4Children provides specialist groups and one to one support for young parents to help with parenting, education, employment and specialist support.

Breastfeeding support

Our children's centres offer calm, relaxed sessions with peer mentors and health visitors for breastfeeding mothers, mothers-to-be, formula fed babies and fathers.

Community Childcare Hubs

4Children's new model of joined up and flexible childcare is especially valuable for families with more than one child and working irregular hours. Hubs provide one point of contact for childcare needs.

Big Cook, Little Cook

Information, inspiration and support about food and nutrition for parents and children.

Working together

Support to help separated families work together as parents in the best interests of their children.

Give Me Strength

4Children's national campaign demands a move to early intervention to prevent family crisis - and an end to wasting money and wasting lives.

One-to-one support sessions

At home or in the centre, 4Children provides practical help for parents with multiple problems and challenges.

No longer suffering in silence

Non-stigmatising, family orientated support for mothers and fathers suffering with depression, anxiety and low self-esteem including post natal depression.

Helping hands

4Children works with families through Helping Hands to provide help and support to escape drug or alcohol dependency.

Family turnaround project - Wandsworth

Our integrated approach works with families with multiple and complex problems, intervening early, focusing on the whole family, preventing escalation and working in partnership to provide early help.

Setting sights high for children and young people

Talk with me

Through Talk with Me sessions 4Children helps children and families with Special Educational Needs in sensory rooms and speech and language therapy.

Cultural support groups

We work with local community and cultural groups to run children's history, language and play sessions for families new to the UK in a richly diverse programme of specialist groups and activities.

Great childcare all year round

Our 50 nurseries and out of school clubs operate throughout the year - supporting children to develop and learn and offering great support for parents.

Airplay

4Children and the RAF Benevolent Fund run Airplay on all RAF stations in the UK providing great activities and support for young people designed and helping relieve some of the pressure on RAF families.

Forest School Adventure

Learning and adventure for children exploring outdoors.

Chill at 4Children

In our 0-19 centres we work with local youth services and other key partners to deliver alternative education programmes for young people at risk of exclusion from school.

Improving outcomes

4Children's services are innovative, flexible and responsive – we recognise that every family is unique. We value all children as individuals and ensure every child's needs are met by encouraging children and their parents to learn and develop through play. We involve children and parents as active participants in their own lives and local services. Children, young people and families influence how provision is shaped and developed to ensure our services remain accessible and relevant.

Working in partnership

We develop our children's centres as multi-agency hubs and co-locate with our partners to achieve effective integration and common purpose. 4Children is committed to working in partnership with children, young people, families, health agencies, schools, statutory agencies, the voluntary and community sector and local authorities.

Early intervention 0 – 19

Our high quality integrated family support and parenting services help families with multiple and complex problems achieve positive outcomes and prevent escalation to specialist services.

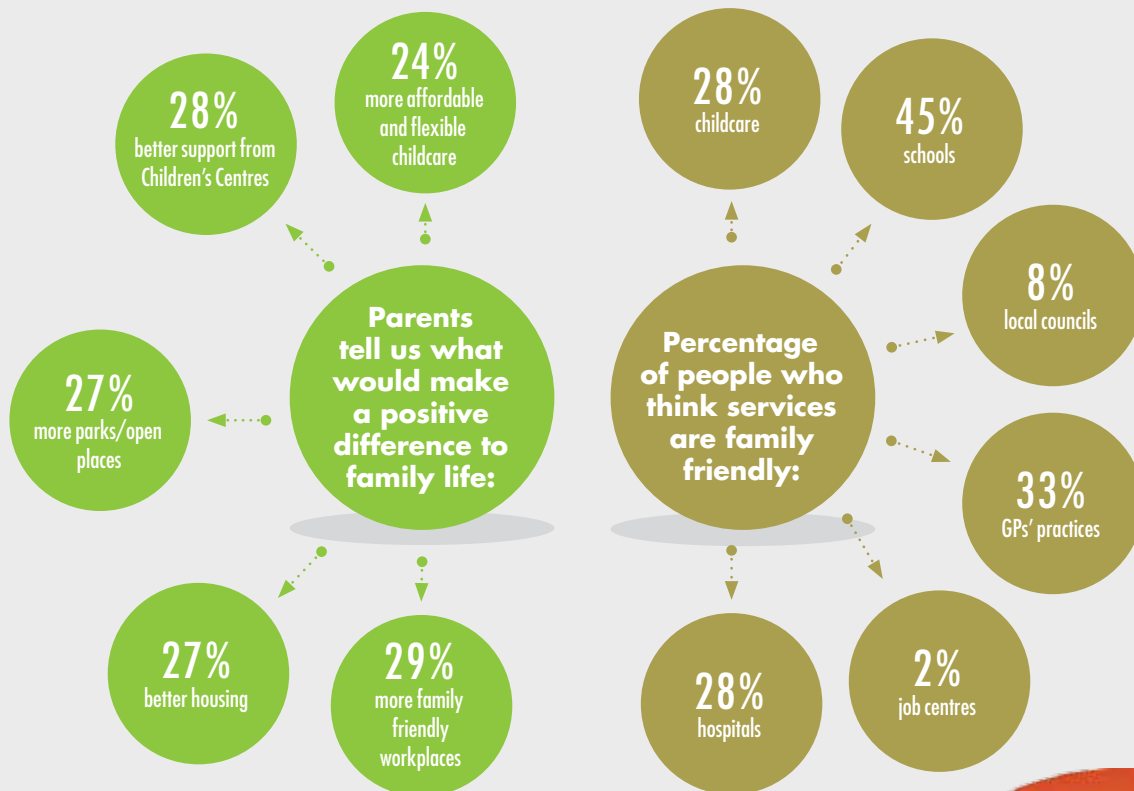


Looking to the future for children and families

4Children sets sights high for children and families. At the end of our 30th year we are now looking to the future with our new manifesto *Making Britain Great for Children and Families* where we set out a blueprint for action to support children and families for generations to come.

As a country, we have choices about the kind of society we want for our children and families. As we look to the end of the current economic crisis, it is time to rethink and reshape our services and communities to enable all families to flourish and to offer vulnerable families the help they need to transform their lives. It is time to take action and to invest in our future. We have the opportunity to make Britain great for children and families for future generations.

4Children's manifesto for the future, *Making Britain Great for Children and Families*, throws down the gauntlet to politicians, policy and decision makers. It calls for them to reshape this country's public services, spaces and workplaces in response to the dramatic changes to modern family life. It demands that we act now to prevent family crisis and enable all children to flourish.

A great Britain creates a positive environment for all families to flourish with specialist help and early intervention for those who need it to reduce or prevent crisis.

A new commitment to families in Britain

4Children is calling decision makers throughout the land to make a new commitment to families. At its heart would be a radical change in the approach to working with children and families to achieve longer term generational change over decades to come. This longer term approach will be rooted in understanding how to support sustainable families and will work with the strengths of families through a joined up approach.

Britain needs a culture change in its whole system of support for families that moves from transacting with families to building trusted relationships. It will be backed by a new generation of staff that can positively support the vulnerable children and families they are working with to achieve real change.

A great Britain for all families

- ➔ A family commitment from government to consider the needs of families in everything they do
- ➔ A comprehensive universal affordable childcare guarantee from 0-14
- ➔ Part-time and flexible working with flexible maternity and paternity leave
- ➔ Children and Family Centre Hubs offering help advice and specialist, co-ordinated services for families in greater need

Great childhoods for all children

- ➔ World class support during pregnancy, antenatal and postnatal support
- ➔ Great services for early years and support to help children and young people to develop and learn
- ➔ Safe and inspirational places for children to play and for young people to meet
- ➔ Determined action on bullying, health and child obesity
- ➔ Specialist help to support children with specific needs – early intervention to build social and emotional capabilities and intensive turnaround for teenagers in trouble

Transforming the lives of vulnerable families

- ➔ Early help in every community, through Children and Family Centres and Hubs to prevent crisis
- ➔ Intensive help to overcome drug and alcohol dependency, mental health problems and domestic violence
- ➔ Family support for all families who are just coping and to help tackle problems head on before they take over
- ➔ Intensive family support for all families in crisis, to turnaround problems through practical help and challenge
- ➔ A new outcomes-based approach to child protection and care, with intensive support, including kinship care

Good places to grow up in

- ➔ A family commitment to all aspects of the local community, including planning, public spaces and parks, transport and policing
- ➔ A major programme of building to create affordable and social housing
- ➔ Intensive action to eradicate the issues behind so called 'problem estates' and build positive communities for children and families, including action on gangs

A new approach to help for families - Children and Family Centres

4Children has developed a model for Children and Family Centres, which delivers real change for families. These multi-purpose community 'hubs' provide a vital and trusted resource for all local families and communities, from pregnancy through to the teenage years, with extra help for those that need it.

Centres bring together and co-ordinate services – from midwives and health visitors to childcare, out of school and youth support. Universal advice and activities mean centres are there for everyone, with specialist help on hand for families with greater needs – help with parenting, debt and housing and support

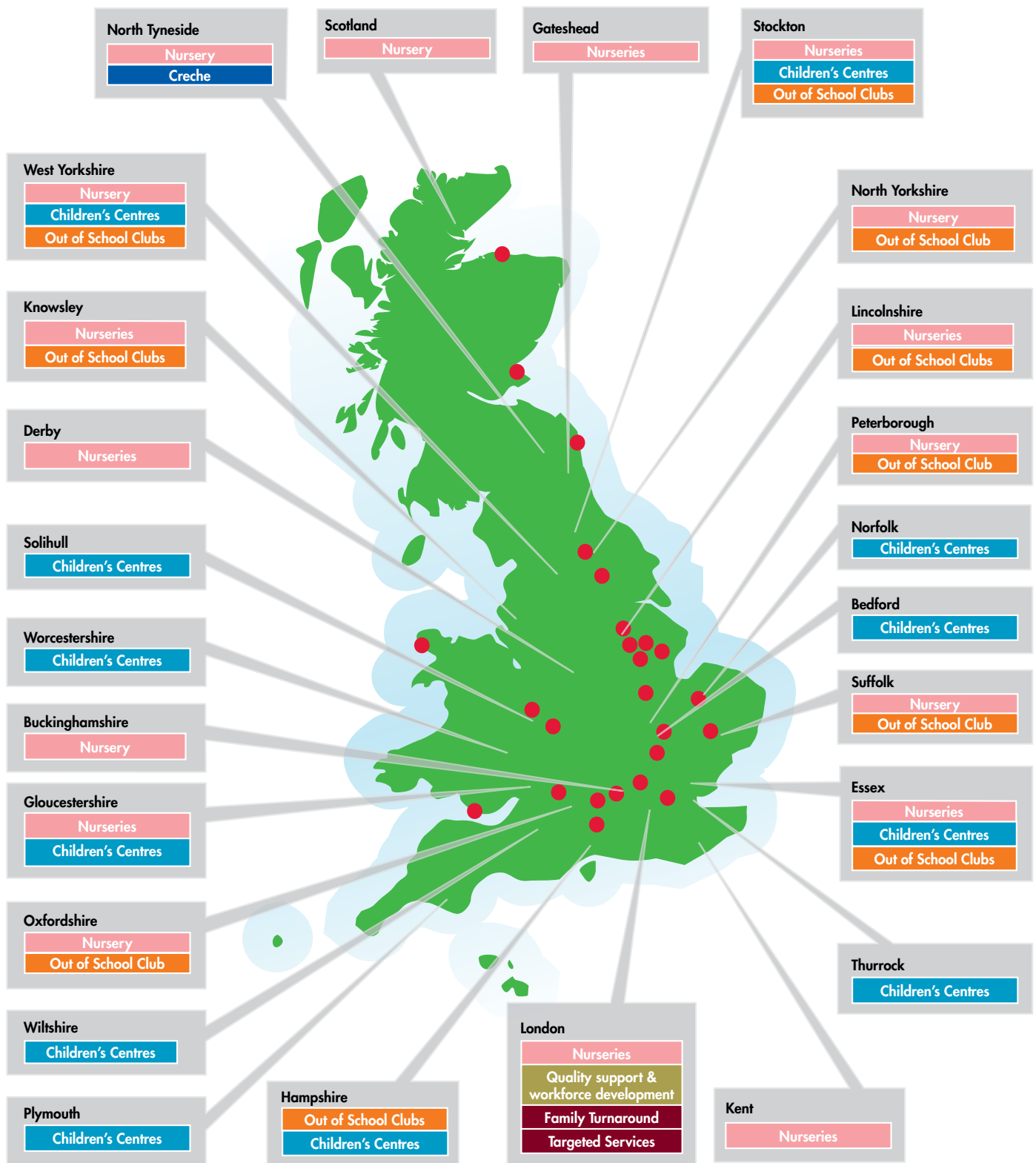
to tackle many of the underlying issues of family crisis – domestic abuse, alcohol and drug addiction and poor mental health for families struggling to cope.

Over a million families now rely on children's centres. This could double over the next five years if we extend their reach to older children and their wider families and place them at the heart of the community.
